TOPIC: ACADEMIC WRITING

RESOURCE PERSONS: ASST. PROF. RESHMI S JACOB & ASST. PROF. AADHIRA M SOLOMON

As part of the Internal Online FDP series organized by Saintgits College of Applied Sciences, the Department of Corporate Economics handled a session on 'Banking Trends in India' on 14th June 2021 through Googlemeet. The session began by the welcome address by Principal, Dr. K. K. John. Asst. Prof. Reshmi Susan Jacob and Asst. Prof. Aadhira Merita Solomon jointly did the presentation. The session was focussed on the recent trends taking place in the Indian banking sector. The first half of the session was delivered by Asst. Prof. Reshmi Susan Jacob where she detailed the history of banking in India. The area of discussion included the history of banking in pre-independence period followed by growth of indigenous banking system. Later major incidents like evolution of State Bank of India and nationalization of banks were also explained. The second half of the session was on Basil Norms which was handled by Asst. Prof. Aadhira Merita Solomon. Glimpses about Basil norms was shared then. The history of Basil norms, its objectives and the four important Basil norms were discussed. The session also saw the recent trends taking place in the Indian Financial Service sector. Many reforms were introduced in a timely manner which have laid strong basis for financial stability in our country. The nationalisation of banks started in 1955 with nationalising SBI. It was followed by nationalisation of 14 banks in 1969 and 6 banks in 2000. It paved way to rescue many private sector banks which were in loss in the preceding time period. The main objective was to ensure that financial institutions have enough capital with them to meet their obligations and absorb unexpected losses. The session was concluded by the remarks by Associate Director, Prof. M.

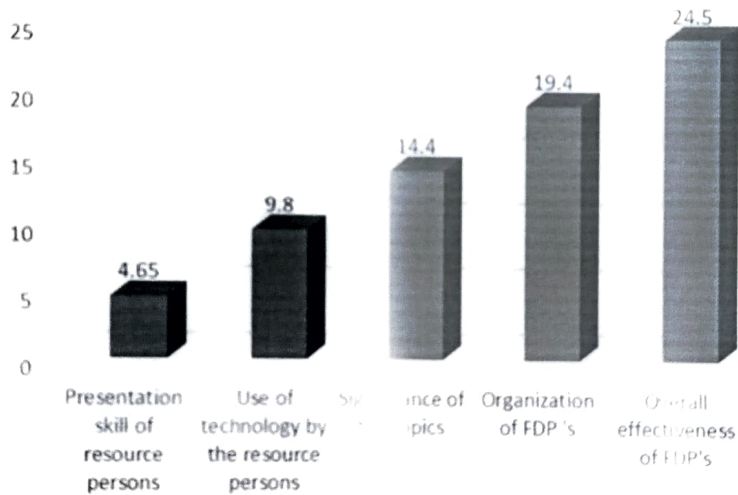
